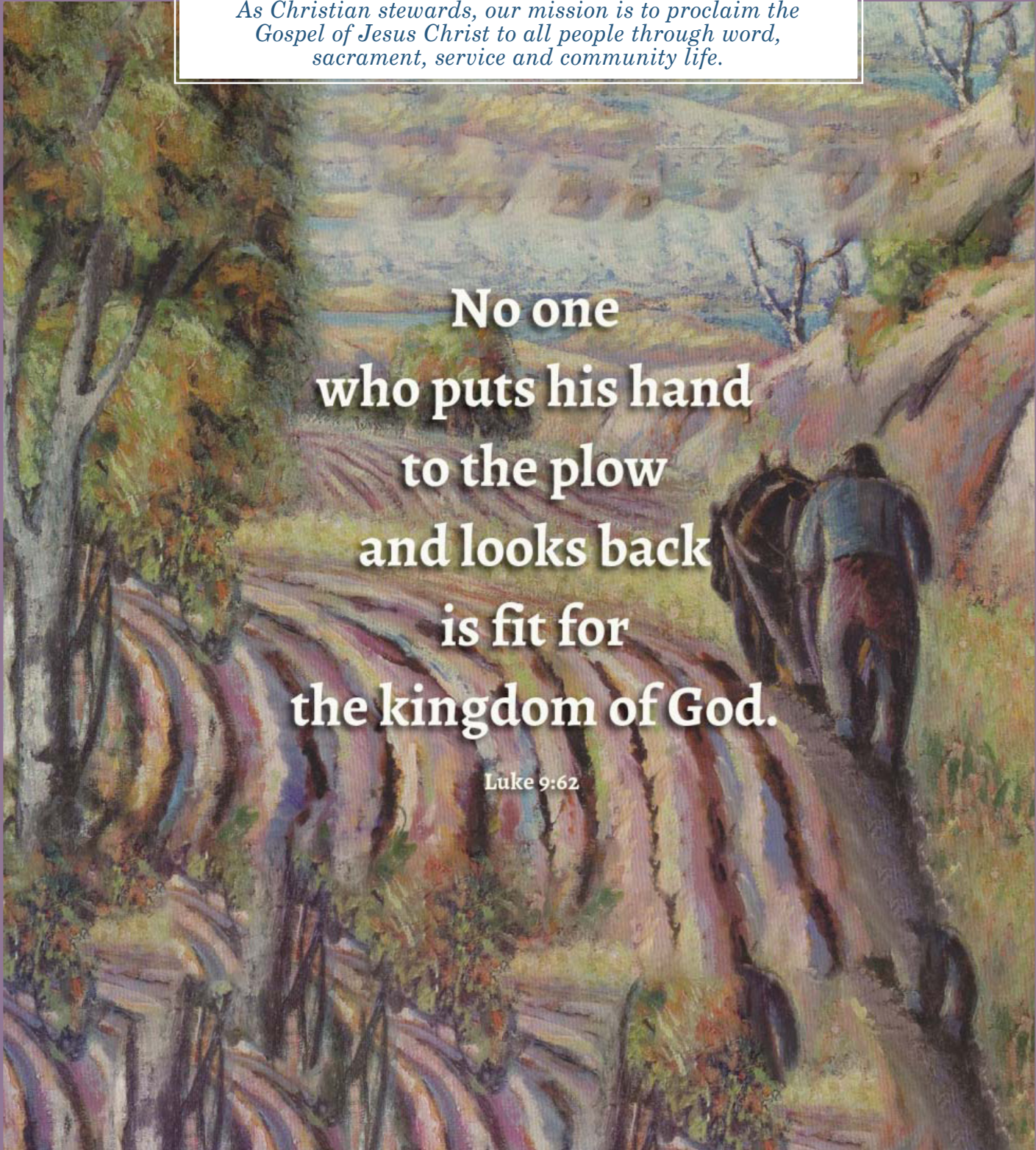

Pastor's corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Thank you for your prayers especially while I was recovering from COVID. My prayers go out to all who continue to suffer from the effects of this disease. Thank you for all the food and supplies that you dropped off while I was quarantining. Father Ruben is also doing better, and he also thanks you for your prayers.

I am grateful to Father Hoa for covering so many of the Masses, Confessions and even a Quinceañera! Special thanks to Msgr. Doktorczyk and Father John Weling for also covering Masses and Confessions.

Today is the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. This is the time between Easter Season and Advent. It is also the time between Christmas and Lent. This is the time to reflect on the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ including how the prophets prepared for his coming into the world even in Old Testament times.

The First Reading is from the First Book of Kings, chapter 19. The Prophet Elijah had tried to bring the Israelite people back to the Lord after they had abandoned God to follow false gods. But the people tried to kill Elijah and he fled from them. The Lord ordered Elijah to stop hiding and get back to work. The Prophet must anoint better kings and especially he must anoint Elisha as a prophet to succeed Elijah.

Elisha was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen. That's very impressive that he could control twenty-four oxen. Elijah threw his cloak over Elisha indicating that he was being called by the Lord to be a prophet. Elisha asked to kiss his father and mother goodbye before following Elijah as an apprentice prophet. If you are having trouble following who's who because their names are so similar, join the club.

Elisha slaughtered the twenty-four oxen and used the plowing equipment for fuel to cook them for his extended family. You would think they would have preferred to have the oxen and plowing equipment for their livelihood. What Elisha was indicating was his total abandonment of his former way of life. He was willing to give up everything and follow the Lord's calling as a prophet. Nothing was going to tempt him to go back. What are we willing to give up in order to follow our Lord? The apostles left their boats and fishing gear and followed Jesus. (Mark 1:16-20) However, the rich young man could not give up his possessions when asked to follow Jesus. (Mark 10:17-31) I want to believe that later on this man changed his mind, gave his possessions to the poor and followed Jesus.

We hear in today's Responsorial Psalm: "You will show me the path to life, fullness of joys in your presence, the delights at your right hand forever." (Psalm 16:11) Let us pray with Elijah, Elisha and our fellow disciples in today's response: "You are my inheritance, O Lord."

Jesus makes clear the cost of being his disciple in today's Gospel Reading, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what he left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." (Luke 9:62)

I know there are men and women who feel the call to dedicate their lives to the Lord. I pray that the Lord will give you the strength to say, "Yes." May your response be, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening; you have the words of everlasting life." (Today's Alleluia verse: 1 Samuel 3:9 and John 6:68).

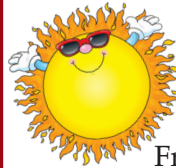

What does it mean to form my conscience?

Catholics have a long tradition of engagement in the public square. Sometimes that engagement requires making difficult moral decisions that impact our own lives and those of others. Our conscience can help guide the decisions we make. The Second Vatican Council guides us: “Always summoning [one] to love good and avoid evil, the voice of conscience can when necessary speak to [one’s] heart more specifically: do this, shun that” (*Gaudium et Spes* 16). However, our conscience doesn’t just come to us when we are born. We must work throughout our lives to form it through prayer, learning, and conversation.

How do I form my conscience?

It takes time to form our consciences so that we can make well-reasoned judgments about particular, real-life situations. The Church teaches that it is important to work continually on conscience formation so we can be prepared to make decisions whenever the opportunity arises. Some specific ideas to form your conscience are:

- 1) Begin by **being open to the truth** and what is right.
- 2) **Study Sacred Scripture** and the **teaching** of the Church.
- 3) **Examine the facts and background information** about various choices and be discerning in where we gather information.
- 4) **Prayerfully reflect** to discern the will of God (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, no. 18).

Additionally, it is important to consider how

our community of faith can help us form good consciences through some of these steps:

- 1) Seek the **prudent advice** and **good example** of trusted leaders and others to support and enlighten our conscience.
- 2) Learn about the **authoritative teaching** of the Church.
- 3) Pray for the **gifts of the Holy Spirit** to help us develop our conscience.
- 4) Regularly partake in an **examination of conscience** to hear God’s voice in your life.¹

Doing the work of forming our consciences can seem daunting. Fortunately, we have many church teachings that can help us in this important task. *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* is an important resource for U.S. Catholics and helps us prayerfully reflect on how we can apply Church teaching in our civic life. “Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere “feeling” about what we should or should not do. Rather, **conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart**, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil.”²

Here are some questions for further reflection:

1. When has my conscience guided me to “do good and avoid evil”?
2. What are some key resources I can use to form my conscience?
3. Forming conscience is a “lifelong task.” What do I do to *regularly* form my conscience? What more should I do?

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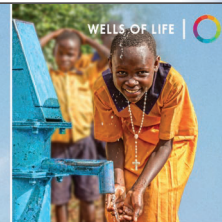
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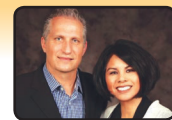
